



Madera Center for the Arts

We continue to move along with the vision to complete a Center for the Arts in Madera. The Elaine Secara Trust endowment is invested specifically for this purpose.

In the Fall, the County, City, School District, and MCAC requested proposals for design of the area being vacated when the courts move to the new Madera County Courthouse. We received proposals from six firms. It is now our goal to interview firms and choose one to draw up some initial plans for the Madera Center for the Arts. Our plan is to choose a firm by February. It won't be long before we form a capital campaign committee to design a plan for funding the construction. MCAC's Signature Programs Continue

Poetry Out Load was created in 2006 by the National Endowment for the Arts and The Poetry Foundation to increase awareness in the art of performing poetry. Nearly all of the Madera County secondary schools are participating this year. Finalists have the opportunity to move on to the State and National levels.

Youth Art Month — March is designated "Youth Art Month," showcasing Madera County students' artwork. Watch for more information as this year's plans are finalized.

Concerts in the Park — Another well-attended summer season was held at Lions Park in Madera and in the Chowchilla downtown park in partnership with the local City governments. Dianne Rich has done a tremendous job over the years showcasing excellent local talent.

Celebrate Agriculture with the Arts — The 22nd Competition and Exhibition closed with comments such as "the best yet" and "It just keeps getting better!" New and returning artists, generous sponsors, faithful patrons, a masterful judge, volunteers, gallery visits and brisk sales—all combined to successfully maintain this MCAC tradition. The 23rd season is upon us. Dates and details are being finalized.

Holiday Art Affair — Another successful art affair under the direction of Abigail Anderson-Shine attracted 25 artisans and has become part of a larger Art Tour in Madera. The weather cooperated, buyers were plentiful, and artisans were pleased!

Developing Partnerships

MCAC continues to branch out to partner with others interested in promoting the Arts.

In the Spring of 2015 MCAC joined with the Madera County Office of Education and the Madera Schools Foundation to support the first annual Arts Fest for the youth of Madera County—teaching, learning, enjoying and showcasing art. This year's Arts Fest is scheduled for Saturday, May 14 at the MCOE office and grounds on Madera Avenue. Prepare to get creative and to be impressed!

In October the Arts Council partnered with **Latinas Unidas and Arte Americas** to bring **Dia de los Muertos** to the people of Madera. It was a huge hit with displays at the local government centers and a celebration with dance, music and food at St. Agnes Chapel in Ripperdan. We hope to expand on this in 2016.

Partnering with the **Chamber of Commerce Tourism Alliance**, the Arts Council organized the children's art booth and poster contest for the **Pomegranate Festival** in November. Artist Jose Elias donated his time and talents to create a reusable hand painted backdrop. Each year, participating children can paint their own pictures to add to the background, thus providing them the opportunity to display their talents on the ever-changing backdrop! This year, we enjoyed the largest group of attendees ever! Students worked with acrylic paints, watercolors, and chalk. They painted on canvas, paper and rocks. Artist and MCAC Board Member Christine Hallett prepared over 200 rocks for students to paint with their own unique designs. Not a single rock was left unpainted!

Scholarships

MCAC offers scholarships annually for Madera County High School Seniors who plan to go to college to major in the Arts. Applications are available at all Madera County high schools. Interested applicants should contact their school counselor. Contributions to MCAC can be directed toward the Scholarship Fund if so desired.

In 2015 we brought back the California State Summer School for the Arts (CSSSA) Scholarship for deserving high school students. Scholarship recipients spend four weeks at the California Institute of the Arts (CalArts) in Valencia, working with artists and perfecting their skills. Areas of study include: Animation, Creative Writing, Dance, Film & Video, Music, Theater, and Visual Arts.

Interestingly, the very first MCAC recipient of this scholarship was given in 1994 to none other than our new Office Admin and Gallery Assistant, Rick Dorris, when he was part of Ginger Latimer's drama program. Rick attended CSSSA for Theatre Arts, with which he is still involved and currently instructing in the MCAC Afterschool Program for the Arts.
