MCAC AWARDED CHUKCHANSI GRANT

Madera County Arts Council received a \$25,000 grant from the Picayune Rancheria of the Chukchansi Indians on June 20th at the annual community grant award dinner. In her acceptance of the award, Tina Holmquist, MCAC 2010-11 Board President, gave thanks to the Tribal Council and Madera County for this opportunity to extend MCAC's very successful artist in the schools programming to some of the elementary schools in the foothill areas of Madera County. This grant will provide opportunities for children from financially and geographically challenged backgrounds to have more exposure to a mainstream arts education curriculum in an atmosphere of respect and knowledge of local cultures, traditions, and beauty.

MCAC artist-teachers have a range of formal and informal training, giving students exposure to techniques of painting, drawing, photography, sculpture, collage, threedimensional art, Native American thread dyeing and basket weaving, origami, et al. In addition to arts content, the lessons will also build vocabulary, improve knowledge

about art and cultural history (w/ particular emphasis on local history and cultures), and incorporate math & science skills at gradeappropriate levels. The children will receive a combination of lecture, demonstration, and hands-on experiences with a variety of materials and art techniques.

Years of research show that art education is closely linked to almost everything that we as a nation say we want for our children - academic achievement, social and emotional development, civic engagement, and equal opportunities in higher education and careers. We look forward to all of the new experiences this grant will help us bring to children in eastern Madera County.

Club YES (Youth Education and Enrichment at School) ARTIST PROFILE - Megann Zebel says YES!

One of the most recent Club YES instructors to come on board is Megann Zebel, a December 2009 summa cum laude graduate from the Fresno State Art Honors Program. She was one of the first students to graduate with an emphasis in Fresno State's new art category: Animation and New Media.

Fortunately for us, Megann answered an MCAC ad and as of January 2011 came on board to the Club YES program. She considers herself a "catch-all" artist, one who has worked with many different mediums. One of her preferences is fiber art and is now in the process of teaching art history - through the creative use of puzzles - and quilting to her first through sixth grade students.

Megann explained that for the sake of both boys and girls, she uses colored paper and yarn for the students' quilting projects. The children can design their own patterns, ranging anywhere from cars and superheroes to birds and landscapes. "There is great satisfaction in watching the children enjoying themselves," Megann admits.

Ms. Zebel herself was educated through

the Madera schools and remembers when artists would visit her classroom and do 'artsy' things with them. How



she loved it! Now she is in the position to give back in the same way and feels honored to continue this same positive experience.

When asked if she is able to utilize her Animation specialization, she admits she hasn't. But it turns out that much of her energy is directed to doll making - elegant dolls with contemporary clothes. She currently has her own online business and plans to look into plastic and resin materials to design and create dolls, in addition to the design and creation of their fashions.

What does she like most about the Club YES program? "I'm simply happy to be involved in art, to give back to the kids, to teach them the power of creativity and the sense of self worth that comes with creative expression."



Fit for Life Triathlon - Club YES

On May 14th at the Town and Country Park, the Club YES students participated and competed in the Madera County Club YES After School Program triathlon along with their families. Club YES, an after school program supported by Madera County Office of Education and the City of Madera Parks and Community Services, co-sponsored this event.

Besides offering a mini health fair at the Inaugural Fit for Life Triathlon, Club YES wanted to incorporate the arts. "We wanted to communicate that the arts and physical activity are important components of being a healthy, well-rounded person," said Sherril Royse, Madera County Arts Council Educational Program Manager. MCAC coordinated 28 artists to work with each of the 28 school sites to help the kids create a banner that represented their school.



These banners were proudly carried by the children in the PARADE OF PARTICIPANTS and then displayed in front of the amphitheater during the event. Judges for the banners included Mayor Poythress of the City of Madera; Mayor Pro Tem Isaac Jackson of Chowchilla; Dianna Marsh, MCAC Board Member; and Dana True and Art Davis from MCOE.

MCAC Awards Scholarships to Five Madera County Graduates

Five high school students were selected to receive \$1,000 scholarships from a pool of very impressive students based on grades, diversity of interests, and having earned the high regard of their teachers and counselors. Four of the scholarships are provided by the Madera County Arts Council and one is the Nancy L. Clute memorial scholarship. These fine students are:

- Francesca Enzler of Madera South High School will be studying Theater Arts at UC Santa Cruz. "While it [theater] provides a wonderful source of entertainment, theater also serves as a social commentary that highlights the virtues and vices of our world and can bring about change for the better."
- Amanda Castillo of Chowchilla Union High School plans to study Digital Arts and Animation at Chapman University. "I hope to one day create cartoons that will entertain and inspire the next generation." Amanda is a member of the National Art Honor Society and was selected to attend the prestigious California School for the Arts.
- Erika Davis of Liberty High School is focusing on Architectural Engineering (with plans for a double major in Architecture) when she attends Cal Poly. "This art is important to me because it brings together my love for Disney with my love for innovative design and mathematics."

- Chase Hagerman of Yosemite High School will major in music when he attends Fresno State University. "It [music] has taught me more than just rhythm and timing and how to read music; it has taught me discipline, self-confidence, leadership, and perseverance."
- Austin Yarbrough of Madera High School plans to study theater, acting, writing and music at Fresno State University. "The time I have spent in theater has shown me that I'm capable of doing just about anything I put my mind to, and that I can overcome any and all obstacles in my way and grow even stronger from my experiences."




