CHUKCHANSI COMMUNITY GRANT UPDATE

Planning, scheduling, and training complete; a few minor glitches finding locations under our belts; and September/ October 2011 saw the launch of the Mountain Schools Visiting Artists program (MSVA). Seven elementary schools in the foothills of Madera County are participating, with almost all 3rd and 4th graders in these schools receiving an hour a week of additional instruction in the arts (in some of the schools 2nd and 5th graders are also enrolled). Similar to other MCAC

visiting artists programs, these teachers will be coordinating their art technique and concept lessons with classroom teachers so that students doing art projects will also have math, reading, science, and history lessons reinforced. MCAC teachers, elementary school teachers and students are excited at the offerings of drawing, weaving, collage, watercolor, and acrylic painting classes at this time. Later in the year, we anticipate adding photography, sculpting, and creative writing modules.

"CHALK THE WALK" CHALLENGE November 19th as part of the MCAC Holiday Art Affair

MCAC will be sponsoring our county's first chalk walk competition as part of the Holiday Art Affair, November 19th. County high schools will compete in drawing and chalking scenes from "The Grinch That Stole

Christmas". The day's event will be a visual and performing art extravaganza of students and local artists demonstrating their talents. The chalk walk challenge will take place in the parking lot area south of the Circle Gallery. This event is presented to raise awareness of the importance of art education in our county. There will be a budding artists avenue where anyone can create their own 2 x 2 foot square for a small donation.

At least \$4,000 in cash awards will be distributed, and a special award of \$300 will be given to the best piece inspired by Hetch Hetchy. 

BETTY FINCH,

Best of Show Award Winner, Artist Background

Betty Finch was raised in Mojave, California and currently lives in Bakersfield. She spent much of her childhood "playing in the desert with toys she made using primitive tools" and natural materials. She put herself through Bakersfield College, then worked as a commercial artist for 2 years before beginning her 25-year career with Kern County Sheriff's Department. Her gourd sculpting career was initially inspired through facial reconstruction techniques she learned in FBI Quantico training and a trip to meet her mentor, Jim Story, in Indiana. After retirement, she was able to travel to China to learn from Mr. Zhang Chairi, "a molded gourd artist renowned for his perfect replications of the molded gourds of Chinese emperors," the preservation of whose work motivated her co-authoring a book *The Immortal Molded Gourds of Mr. Zhang Cairi*. She is currently working on a second book on modern gourd artists in China, raising Appaloosa horses, experimenting in growing molded, hand-trained, and dyed gourds, and creating fine art with gourds.


